- (b) Wherefrom does the 'moping owl' make a complaint?
- (c) What is the full name of Sir Roger?
- (d) Whose real-life experience inspired Defoe to write Robinson Crusoe?
- (e) Which characters take part in the 'Proviso Scene' in Congreve's The Way of the World?
- 2. Answer the following questions (within 600 words):
 - (a) Do you consider the title of Samuel Johnson's 'London' an appropriate one? Justify your answer with reference to the text.

Or

- (b) Comment on Gray's attitude towards death in 'Elegy Written in a Country Churchyard'.
- 3. (a) 'Sir Roger symbolises an ideal feudal paternalism.' Substantiate this view with reference to 'Sir Roger at Home' and 'Sir Roger at Church'.

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- (b) Critically discuss the theme of Addison's essay 'Sir Roger at Church'.
- 4. (a) Do you think Defoe's novel, Robinson Crusoe is merely a travelogue? Justify your answer. 15

- (b) Critically comment on the relationship between Crusoe and Friday in Defoe's novel.
- 5. (a) Discuss Congreve's The Way of the World as a mirror of the contemporary society.

(b) Critically analyse the character of Mirabell in Congreve's The Way of the World.
