- (c) In Shakespeare's Sonnet no. 18, who or what is referred to as 'the eye of heaven'?
- (d) Who are the three sinners addressed by the Porter in Macbeth?

Mention any two titles or posts bestowed on Gaveston by Edward II.

(e) Who were Ganymede and Aliena?

Or,

Whom did Orsino invite as his 'fancy's queen'?

2. Answer any two of the following questions (within 600 words):

- (a) Justify the title of the poem 'The Good Morrow'.
- (b) Critically examine how the final lines of Shakespeare's Sonnet no. 18 effect a shift of focus from the fair friend's beauty to the immortalizing power of poetry.
- (c) Write a critical appreciation of 'One Day I Wrote Her Name'.
- 3. Answer any one of the following questions (within 600 words):

- (a) In Edward II, what is the role of Isabella in a world almost entirely dominated by men?
- (b) How does the 'irony of kingship' unfold in Marlowe's Edward II?
- (c) Examine to what extent Macbeth's actions are motivated by the supernatural.
- (d) Discuss the importance of the Sleepwalking scene in Macbeth.

4. Answer any one of the following questions (within 600 words):

- (a) Twelfth Night is based on a series of mistaken identities and disguises. Discuss.
- (b) Compare Viola and Sebastian in *Twelfth Night*. What influence do they have on the action of the play?
- (c) Examine the character of Rosalind in As You Like It.
- (d) Comment on the role of Touchstone and Jacques in As You Like It.
